

PSALM 76 – New King James Version

To the Chief Musician. On stringed instruments. A Psalm of Asaph. A Song.

¹In Judah God *is* known; His name *is* great in Israel. ²In Salem also is His tabernacle, And His dwelling place in Zion. ³There He broke the arrows of the bow, The shield and sword of battle. *Selah*

Luke 2:30-33;--'Then the angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end' (NKJV).

Ephesians 2:13-14;--'But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility' (ESV).

John 14:27;--'Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid' (NKJV).

Colossians 2:9—'For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily' (ESV).

Acts 4:12;--'Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved' (NKJV).

⁴You *are* more glorious and excellent *Than* the mountains of prey. ⁵The stouthearted were plundered; They have sunk into their sleep; And none of the mighty men have found the use of their hands. ⁶At Your rebuke, O God of Jacob, Both the chariot and horse were cast into a dead sleep.

2 Kings 19:33-37;--'By the way that he came he will return; he will not enter this city, declares the LORD. I will defend this city and save it, for my sake and for the sake of David my servant.' That night the angel of the LORD went out and put to death a hundred and eighty-five thousand in the Assyrian camp. When they people got up the next morning—there were all the dead bodies! So Sennacherib king of Assyria broke camp and withdrew. He returned to Nineveh and stayed there' (NIV).

2 Thessalonians 2:8;--'And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the Lord Jesus will kill with the breath of his mouth and bring to nothing by the appearance of his coming' (ESV).

Isaiah 11:4;--'But with righteousness He shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; He shall strike the earth with the rod of His mouth, and with the breath of His lips He shall slay the wicked' (NKJV)

Revelation 19:15, 21;--'From his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations, and he will rule them with a rod of iron. He will tread the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God the Almighty...And the rest were slain by the sword that came from the mouth of him who was sitting on the horse, and all the birds were gorged with their flesh' (ESV).

Isaiah 11:4;--'But with righteousness shall he judge the poor, and reprove with equity for the meek of the earth: and he shall smite the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips shall he slay the wicked' (KJV)

John 18:6;--'When Jesus said to them, 'I am he,' they drew back and fell to the ground' (ESV).

⁷You, Yourself, *are* to be feared; And who may stand in Your presence When once You are angry? ⁸You caused judgment to be heard from heaven; The earth feared and was still, ⁹When God arose to judgment, To deliver all the oppressed of the earth. *Selah*

Matthew 10:28;--'And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell' (NKJV).

2 Thessalonians 1:6-10;--'since it is a righteous thing with God to repay with tribulation those who trouble you, and to give you who are troubled rest with us when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with His mighty angels, in flaming fire taking vengeance on those who do not know God, and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. These shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power, when He comes, in that Day, to be glorified in His saints and to be admired among all those who believe, because our testimony among you was believed' (NKJV).

Romans 8:1-2;--'There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit' (NKJV).

1 Thessalonians 5:9;--'For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ' (NKJV).

Luke 4:18;--'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed,' (ESV).

¹⁰Surely the wrath of man shall praise You; With the remainder of wrath You shall gird Yourself. ¹¹Make vows to the Lord your God, and pay *them*; Let all who are around Him bring presents to Him who ought to be feared. ¹²He shall cut off the spirit of princes; *He* is awesome to the kings of the earth.

Isaiah 53:5;--'But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed' (NIV).

1 Peter 2:24;--'He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed' (ESV).

Ephesians 4:31;--'Let there be no more resentment, no more anger or temper, no more violent self-assertiveness, no more slander and no more malicious remarks. Be kind to each other, be understanding. Be as ready to forgive others as God for Christ's sake has forgiven you' (J.B.Phillips).

James 1:19-20;--'Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God' (ESV).

Matthew 11:29-30;--'Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light' (NKJV).

John 18:36;--'Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world' (ESV).

1 Samuel 8:19-20;--'Nevertheless the people refused to obey the voice of Samuel; and they said, 'No, but we will have a king over us, that we also may be like all the nations, and that our king may judge us and go out before us and fight our battles' (NKJV).
