New King James Version

To the Chief Musician. Set to "Do Not Destroy." A Psalm of Asaph. A Song.

¹ We give thanks to You, O God, we give thanks! For Your wondrous works declare *that* Your name is near.

Hebrews 13:15:--'Therefore by him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to his name' (NASB).

John 6:54-56:--'He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him' (NASB).

² "When I choose the proper time, I will judge uprightly.

Romans 8:1:--'There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit' (NKJV).

1 Corinthians 3:11-15:--'For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has build on it endures, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire' (NKJV).

³ The earth and all its inhabitants are dissolved; I set up its pillars firmly. *Selah*

2 Peter 3:10:--'But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night, in which the heavens will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up' (NKJV).

Hebrews 12:18, 22-24:--'For you have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them. But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel' (ESV).

⁴ "I said to the boastful, 'Do not deal boastfully,' and to the wicked, 'Do not lift up the horn. ⁵ Do not lift up your horn on high; Do *not* speak with a stiff neck.' "

James 4:10:--'Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he will lift you up' (NKJV).

Matthew 18:3:--'Truly I say to you, unless you are converted and become as little children, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven' (NKJV).

Matthew 11:29:--'Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls'

⁶ For exaltation *comes* neither from the east nor from the west nor from the south.

⁷ But God *is* the Judge: He puts down one, and exalts another.

John 12:47-48;--'If anyone hears my sayings and does not keep them, I do not judge him; for I did not come to judge the world, but to save the world. He who rejects me and does not receive my sayings, has one who judges him; the word I spoke is what will judge him at the last day' (NASB).

James 5:9;--'Do not complain, brethren, against one another, so that you yourselves may not be judged; behold, the judge is standing right at the door' (NASB).

2 Timothy 4:8;--'in the future there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on that day; and not only to me, but also to all who have loved his appearing' (NASB).

⁸ For in the hand of the Lord *there is* a cup, and the wine is red; It is fully mixed, and He pours it out; Surely its dregs shall all the wicked of the earth drain *and* drink down.

Revelation 14:18-20;--'And another angel came out from the altar, who had power over fire, and he cried with a loud cry to him who had the sharp sickle, saying, 'Thrust in your sharp sickle and gather the clusters of the vine of the earth, for her grapes are fully ripe.' So the angel thrust his sickle into the earth and gathered the vine of the earth, and threw it into the great winepress of the wrath of God. And the winepress was trampled outside the city, and blood came out of the winepress, up to the horses' bridles, for one thousand six hundred furlongs' (NKJV).

2 Thessalonians 1:6-8;--'since it is a righteous thing with God to repay with tribulation those who trouble you, and to give you who are troubled rest with us when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, in flaming fire taking vengeance on those who do not know God, and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ' (NKJV).

⁹ But I will declare forever, I will sing praises to the God of Jacob.

Hebrews 13:15;--'Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name' (ESV).

¹⁰ "All the horns of the wicked I will also cut off, *but* the horns of the righteous shall be exalted."

2 Corinthians 10:4;--'For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ, and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled' (NKJV).

Matthew 23:12;--'Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted' (CSB).

Philippians 2:9;--'For this reason also, God highly exalted him, and bestowed on him the name which is above every name,' (NASB).
